Apologies were received from Vice-President J. H. Dunn, and Mr. J. W. Gover.

A very cordial welcome was extended to Colonel Bolton, who was present for the first time since his return from Gallipoli.

Mr. F. Herman } The Minutes of the meeting held on the 28th Cr. T. Harley } July, 1916, were read and confirmed.

Mr. F. Herman } It was unanimously resolved that a letter Cr. G. Fitches } ~~Sympathy~~ be sent to Mr. Markele, expressing the Council's sincere sympathy for him on account of his severe illness, and desiring him not to take up his duties at the School, until he was completely restored to health.

Mr. G. Fitches } The Report of the Headmaster of the Junior Cr. A. O. Stubbs } Technical School (Mr. A. W. Steane) was received and adopted.

Mr. A. O. Stubbs } The Trades Board Report, presented by the Cr. F. Saunders } chairman (Mr. E. J. McConnon) was received and adopted.

A letter was read from the Advisory Council of Science and Industry, relative to the discouraging enlistment of men with scientific and technical training.

Mr. F. Herman } It was resolved that the letter be received. Cr. T. Harley }

The Principals (Messrs. C. Fenner and H. H. Smith) presented their recommendations with regard to the awarding of the gold medals which are to be presented annually to students of the School.
