The Minutes of the meeting held on the 26th January, 1917 were read and confirmed, and after discussion it was resolved to add the following clause to the resolution referring to the meetings between the Principals and Mr. Martell.

adopted by the Council, and that the

increases in salaries was to be contingent
on the passing of the Estimates and the
allocation of grants.
