(Resolutions &amp;c correspondence continued).

That the Education Department be asked either to transfer the lay figure to the Technical Art School or to pay two-thirds of the money towards the cost of the model.

Mr W. D. Hill } That the Registrar consult with Messrs.  
Mr D. Ronaldson } Shirley and Stephenson relative to the  
registration of Miss Abrahams' teachers.

Mr D. Maxwell } It was resolved: That Mr Marable be  
Mr J. S. Hickery } instructed to collect the fees outstanding  
as per list submitted at the meeting, together  
with fees outstanding up to the end of the  
first quarter, 1917, & that another list be prepared for the  
October meeting (one copy for each member of the Council) showing  
the balance of fees due.

It was resolved that Messrs W. D. Hill and  
P. A. Brown be appointed, in the places of Mr.

Fenton and the late Hon. R. T. Vale, as members  
of the Special Committee to discuss arrangements  
for the next annual Prize-Giving (see meeting, 25. 2. 16).

An application was received from Mr W. Kenneth  
for an increase in salary, and it was resolved  
that application be made to the Minister to  
sanction an increase up to the minimum  
salary allowed to other instructors doing  
equivalent work. Carried unanimously.

Mr Hickery suggested that  
the School staff should undertake research  
work in connexion with brown coal. The  
President (Mr M. Copland) stated that this  
matter was under consideration and would  
be taken in hand as soon as opportunity occurred.

School was approved.

Mr W. T. Humphreys } A sum of £3 "2" 6 was approved for  
Mr J. J. Brokershire } the erection of a cyclone gate for the Art  
School furnace room.

Mr W. T. Humphreys } Resolved that Miss Lomie's wages be  
Mr J. J. Brokershire } raised by five shillings per week.

Ed. 117. A letter was read from the Education Department  
28.8.1917 approving of a special grant of £25 for completing  
portions of the fixings in the Chemical School.
