Meeting of the Special Committee held on  
Friday, 15<sup>th</sup> November, 1918 at 8 p.m.

Present: The President (Mr W. H. Middleton) in  
the chair, The Principal (Mr M. Copland) and  
the Art Principal (Mr H. H. Smilt).

An apology was received from Vice President  
W. J. Humphreys.

The new regulations for Technical Schools  
were discussed and the following questions  
raised:-

Regn. XXXVII. Do the provisions of clauses  
1, 2 + 3 apply to Councils established  
prior to 1911 and if so to what schools.  
Clause 16. Section 1. What is the position  
with regard to members other than  
principals and senior members of the staff.

It was resolved that the following motion  
be submitted for discussion at the conference  
of the Technical Schools' Association to be  
held at Bendigo on the 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> inst.  
"That at an early date an influential  
deputation wait on the Minister to urge  
upon him the immediate necessity of adopting  
a scheme of classification for Technical  
Schools".

Questions re new Regulations (continued)  
Clause 48. Request that 4 weeks be  
altered to 11 weeks.

also suggest that the minimum hours  
for all full time instructors be uniform  
in all schools, i.e. 35<sup>hours</sup> per week for  
trade teachers and 30 hours per week  
for full time instructors.
