Meeting of the Special Committee held on Friday 16th May, 1919 at 8 p.m. to confer with Mr Carew Smyth on the following matters:-

1. The appointment of a successor to Mr H. B. Herbert
2. To consider the re-organisation of the Art School Staff
3. To consider the provision of accommodation for the Dressmaking Classes and of a Common Room for the female members of the Art School Staff and the Girl Students.

The following members of the Committee were present: The President (Mr W. H. Middleton) in the chair The Art Inspector (Mr P. M. Carew Smyth), Councillors Barrow, Hurley and Maxwell, The Principal (Mr M. Copland) and the Art Principal (Mr H. H. Smitt).

Apologies were received from ^{Vice President} Councillors J. S. Vickery and ^{Councillor} A. O. Stubbs.
