5. H. Eklund re Diploma of School.

1. It was resolved to refer Mr. Blauk's letter re University Appeal to members of the school staff.

2. That details of Mr. Eklund's fees and the issue of his Diploma be left to the President for settlement.

The President reported that he had received a letter from the Technical Schools Association regarding certain clauses contained in Regulation 37 governing Technical schools.

Representatives from the schools had interviewed Mr. Tate, who agreed to the amendments proposed, which were later submitted to the Bendigo school by letter from Mr. Tate and found to be unsatisfactory.

These particulars were subsequently submitted by the President to Major Baird who promised to interview and acquaint the Minister of the agreement arrived at with the Director so that he, (The Minister) may leave a minute regarding this agreement for his successor.

It was decided to purchase from C-Henman the Dunlop Rubber Coy. $22\frac{1}{2}$ yards $\frac{3}{16}$ Nicholson Rubber Matting @ £1-4-3 per yard for the floor of public office also a supply of Coir Matting for the entrance adjoining the Council Room.
