Dear Sir or Madam,

I should like to draw your attention to the facilities offered by the Ballarat School of Mines, to those desiring to undertake University work for degrees in Arts and Science.

Classes are held at the School in the following subjects which are recognised by the Melbourne University:-

Pure Mathematics	1.
Mixed "	1.
Chemistry	1.
Natural Philosophy	1.
Geology	1.
Graphics	1.

The fee per subject is £1:5:0 per term or £4:4:0 per term for four or more subjects.

Students of the School of Mines in any of the above subjects do not pay fees to the University other than for examination, these being set down at £1:1:0 per subject or £3:3:0 for a full degree year.

The total fees at the School of Mines for a full Science first year course, including examinations, amount to £19:19:0 which is approximately the same as the charge made to students in attendance at the University.

In addition the Council are arranging to conduct classes in English 1, British History A & B, Latin 1, and French 1. They are approaching the University to place these classes on the same footing as the above; which will mean that the University will charge an examining fee only.

In the practical classes, the apparatus is such, that the same grade of work can be undertaken in Ballarat as in the laboratories of the University.

Intending students for 1923 are requested to forward their names to the undersigned as soon as possible.
