It was resolved that all future correspondence, presented to Council Meetings Mr Lederman & Mr Elworthy be taken as read except in instances when a special reading is asked for.

It was decided to change N. H. Mayo's half fees for classes Mr Fitches and, in accordance with a previous Elworthy resolution of this Council - to refund the amounts paid on a satisfactory attendance Report from the Principal

On the motion of Mr Lederman & seconded by Vice Pres. Mr Purnow it was resolved to extend an invitation to the Committee of the Old Colonists Club to visit the classes of the school on an evening to be arranged.

Mr D. Champion and Spring were appointed to interview Mr Purnow and Mr P. Purnow-Legg with a view to the allocation of portion of the City Council's Loan, towards the improvement of St Luke's Flat

Amongst the general business of the meeting the President reported having waited, together with the Principal, on the Minister and Mr Tate regarding the establishment of University classes at the school early this year.

Arrangements were made whereby a scheme should be drawn up, and submitted to the Registrar of the University for the approval of the University Council.

The probability of the founding of a scholarship to be called "The Professor Smith" scholarship, was discussed. It was arranged that the President take steps towards a preliminary meeting, enlisting the cooperation of past students and the public, in support of the movement.

The desirability of holding a series of Open Nights and extending invitations to Public Bodies was also discussed.
