REPORT OF MEETING

- held at the School of Mines on 21st Sept 1922 -
to discuss with SIR JAMES BARRATT the proposed establishment
of a University College in Ballarat

Apologies were received from Messrs A. O. Stubbs and Bro Henry

The Mayor (Mr S. Elsworth) was voted to the Chair.

Mr Middleton explained that on September 15th Sir James Barratt
came to Ballarat and asked to see the members of the University
College Committee - some of the members of the ^{Committee} met him
and discussed the question of a University College for Ballarat.
Mr Heseltine and he (Mr Middleton) who are supposed to be members
of the Committee were not invited to attend and after having read
the report of the meeting next morning and knowing that Sir James
Barratt was going to the Govar hospital in the afternoon they
decided to put the case before him from a School of Mines view
point of the establishment of a University College in Ballarat.
Sir James Barratt was then good enough to say that he would come
to Ballarat today and would like to meet the committee in connec-
tion with the School of Mines Council and see if an understand-
ing as to the best means of establishing a college in Ballarat could
not be arrived at between the two bodies concerned.
