4. Matriculated students who have completed the course for a diploma at a recognized technical college may be granted partial exemption from the requirements for any Bachelor's degree in engineering, agriculture, or science.

A candidate must make application to the appropriate faculty and furnish with such application evidence as to previous training and examinations.

The faculty shall define his status and determine the conditions under which he may complete the course for the degree and in the case of a candidate the course prescribed for whom in any year is considered the equivalent for a year of the course as prescribed in the regulations may grant him permission to compete for inclusion in class lists and for exhibitions in such subjects as it may determine.

The faculty may give such credit as it deems fit for:-

- (a) Subjects passed in the course for the diploma.
- (b) Additional subjects passed at a technical college which are not included in the course for the diploma taken by the candidate.
- (c) Subjects of any year of the course for the degree to which he wishes to proceed which have been passed by the candidate at an honor examination prior to matriculation.

(Sir James Barrett here explained that if you like to put on extra subjects they count - that is a point - English and literature have never been applied for but they might be subjects)

Any student of a school of mines or technical college in Victoria recognized for this purpose by the Council on the recommendation of the Technical Colleges Board who produces to the appropriate faculty satisfactory evidence of having received liberal instruction in any subject of the courses for degrees in engineering or for the diploma in Mining or in Metallurgy or in any first year subject of the courses for degrees in science or in agricultural science or for the diploma of agriculture accepted by the faculty as equivalent in character and amount to the instruction required in the university may be admitted to examination in that subject on payment of the following fees:-

All subjects first year £3-3-0; Second year £4-4-0; 3rd year £5-5-0; 4th year £5-5-0. For each single subject one half of the above fees. The provision shall not apply to candidates for degrees in medicine and surgery. (the candidate pays no university fees)

Under our new regulations he may be admitted here - if 6 people want to be examined they can be examined in Ballarat.

The following Schools of Mines and Technical Colleges have been recognized by the Council under the provisions of this regulation:-

Ballarat School of Mines, Bendigo School of Mines, Working Mens College Melbourne, also the Castlemaine Technical School for the purpose of the Thompson Scholar, also the Swinburne College, and Gordon College Geelong.

Those are the Regulations of the University which you can act under.
