Council

Authority was granted for the appointment of Mr Maxwell of Mr L. Teunon as evening Instructor in Evening Civil Engineering, 2 evenings per wk at the rate of 7/6 per hour, as recommended in the Principal's Report.

The Council received, with regret, the report of the unfortunate accident which befell Miss Young Headmistress of the Art Teaching Staff. It was resolved

that three months leave of absence be granted and a letter expressing the Council's sympathy be forwarded to Miss Young.

The Art Principal referred to a recent statement of the Director of Education (Mr Tate) inferring that "none of the Art schools of the State are developed beyond the capacity of training students and teachers above junior work" as published in the "August"

As the statement was a serious reflection upon the name and reputation of the school, Mr Smith suggested that the attention of the Minister should be drawn to the statement in a letter sent by this Council.

The matter was referred to a meeting of the Finance Committee for consideration and drafting of the letter.

Amongst the Correspondence received was a letter from the Ed. Dept. enclosing a copy of the Report of the Board of Inspectors and requesting the comments of the Council on the portions indicated therein.
