in order to assist and enable the school to reopen the exhibit building to the public. He - The President, would suggest the sum of £250 be granted.

Mr Lederman supplemented the remarks of the President.

The Principal, Mr A. F. Herelme explained the details of requirements.

The Mayor agreed that the school possessed in the Museum an institution which is of much public interest and was deserving of the Council's support.

The matter would be discussed by the City Council and consideration would be given to an allotment of money, if not the whole amount, it was possible that a portion would be voted annually.

Mr A. Mackenzie agreed that the school had put a strong case. The Museum was a great attraction to visitors and public. It was very disappointing to see it closed. The feeling of the City Council was favorable but scarcity of money had hampered them. The school would however have fair consideration and justice.

All the other members present supported what had been said.

The President again referred to the necessity of obtaining sufficient money in the first place in order that the War Museum should be opened - In thanking members for their attendance he regretted that the late hour prevented a tour and inspection of classes.
