Monthly Meeting of Finance Committee held on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> May 1927 at 7.15 p.m.

Present — The President, Mr W.H. Middleton in the Chair, Vice-Presidents Messrs D. Maxwell and F. Baunow, The Treasurer, Mr W. J. Humphreys, Councillors Penny, L. Lederman, L. Maddern and the Principal Mr A. F. Beseltine.

Minutes of meeting held on 27<sup>th</sup> April 1927 were read and confirmed.

Accounts amounting to £1647.13.0 were recommended for payment.

It was resolved that all students receiving the benefit of free tuition must attend Terminal Examinations as a condition of their course of study.

The Registrar was instructed to submit a draft copy of proposed letter to be sent to students receiving free tuition, urging them as a duty that they should agree to support the school according to their success and ability to do so in later years.

It was agreed that a detailed account setting forth the value of fees allowed to individual free students be forwarded to each student annually.
