Special Meeting of Finance Committee held on Monday 9th July 1928 at 4.40 P.M.  
Present - The President - Mr. H. Middleton in the chair, Vice Presidents, Mr. D. Maxwell and J. Barrow, The Treasurer, Mr. J. L. Humphreys, Mrs L. Maddern, J. Donaldson, The Principal, Mr. H. F. Herelbine and the Asst Principal - Mr. H. H. Smith.

The question of the remodelling of the Dressmaking Department, and the provision of suitable Buildings for the use of the Junior Girls school was discussed.

The President reported the recent visits of inspection by Messrs Donald Clark and Elwood Smith who, with Council members & staff, had examined the various proposals regarding building extensions at Albert St. The Gaol and the White Flat sites.

Particulars of valuation of the properties comprising the selected area at White Flat were submitted by Mr Maddern. It was agreed that this site was the most suited for future expansion and resolved that a letter be forwarded to the Ed Department, asking that a departmental officer or valuer be sent to Ballarat with a view to the school's acquisition of this property also asking that the amount required (about £3000) be made available to the Council in order to complete the purchase.
