

Other schools do not find it necessary to engage the time and attention of Principals for almost every individual wishing to join any particular department of the School. It is fitting that the office should have sufficient discretion to decide in a large number of cases on the action to be taken by the student to ensure a correct adjustment or classification.

Melbourne Schools make a flat rate charge for the group of subjects allied to any particular study and it remains with the student to take advantage of all that is offered.

It is pointed out that students place a higher value on their study when a higher fee is demanded but in any case a student's work is limited to the few hours per session available according to his or her own opportunities - the flat rate scale of charges makes for a most satisfactory adjustment.
