

begin to progress and ^{teachers} men who are capable and enthusiastic are necessary - This school was fortunate in this respect.

The Teachers Act required that all teachers be taken away and controlled by the secondary branch - which is not a Technical Branch but one under which the Technical school man was subordinated.

This Ballarat school was fortunate in not being controlled by the Education Department.

Teachers under Council control were not tied down but whether in the Public Service or under Council control should possess equal rights for appointments &c. as was formerly recognized.

Industrial work was continually changing and we must look ahead and change our classes accordingly.

Teachers should be always adaptable and ready to switch over to new changes.

It was moved by G. Ledenman and seconded by G. Ronaldson that a ^{to Ledenman} resolution be placed on the minutes ^{of Ronaldson} expressing the appreciation of the School Council of the valued services rendered by the Chief Inspector of Technical schools - Mr Donald Clark during

the period of his association with Technical Education.

It was also resolved to send a letter embodying the foregoing resolution to Mr Clark from the Council.
