Schools and who had been away for a period from any school.

Money was scarce and many could not afford to pay fees.

Employers found it impossible to hold on to their apprentices and this is where the schools can step in and help by affording all - every opportunity to attend technical schools.

There was no need to be too pessimistic - we should now prepare students for employment rather than when times were more to improve.

In making further reference to economies Mr. Ethan suggested that the need for the continuance of Mr. Maxwell's position and that of Miss Wright in the two schools should be carefully examined.

It would be necessary for the Council to adopt a smaller maintenance scale if the school overdraft was to be reduced.

It was a good plan to have a listing of the boys of the junior and senior schools and teachers should exercise some influence over boys. Certain members of staff could be used for the intermediate stage between the junior and the senior schools. The amalgamation of classes, where numbers were small, was advisable. Costs per student must not exceed a certain limit.
