VISITING COMMITTEE - Curo Heathcote reported
 on behalf of The Visiting Committee :-
 Electric Wiring, Carpentry, Engineering
 Workshop Practice and other Classes
 were visited. Large classes were
 in attendance at Carpentry and
 the Fitting. A total of 93 boys
 were enrolled in fitting practice
 including 27 students in the un-
 employed division. It was noted
 that Mr Goldsmith - the Instructor,
 was preparing and making
 instruments for testing pressure
 gages and also making telescope
 apparatus for the Centenary
 celebrations in Melbourne.

In the Art classes all sections
 were occupied with terminal ex-
 aminations. It was noticed that
 student-teachers were not attend-
 ing these examinations.

19 students were in attendance
 at Pottery and the work being
 done was highly creditable.

An attendance of four at the
 lettering classes was unsatisfactory.
