Visiting Committee's Report.

Mr Koff said that he and Mr Nicholson had visited the evening trade classes during the month. In the Blacksmithing Department they found one of the forges to be in bad condition. On a previous visit, two other forges had been in a bad state of repair but these had since received attention and they understood that the one requiring repairs now would be attended to at an early date.

In theoxy-Acetylene Department the gauges and tubing were in an unsatisfactory condition and did not permit of the best work to be done by students. Their next port of call was the Carpentry Shop where they found a full complement of students doing excellent work. The Shikering Machine was in a bad condition and it was doubtful whether it was worth reconditioning.

In the Machine Shop they found the new lathe in operation. This was a very fine machine although the lighting over the machine could be improved. They also found a lecture in progress with the aid of the Strip Film Projector. This was a very fine thing and they found it hard to tear themselves away.

In the Plumbing Department they found that a coat of paint would effect a big improvement to the walls and ceilings.

The students' lockers in the main entrance to the school were next inspected and found to be in an untidy condition. They would suggest that these be moved to another portion, such as the Students Room, as apart from their untidy appearance they cause considerable congestion in the main entrance.
