Minutes The minutes of the last Council Meeting  
held on the 23<sup>rd</sup> February were taken and  
read and were confirmed.

Business. Mica Smith, Sergeant and Bonworkers' Scholarships  
out of It was resolved that the recommendation of  
Minutes the Finance Committee - "that the revenue from  
the three scholarship funds be pooled and that  
two scholarships of £30 per year each for three  
years to be known as the Mica Smith and  
Sergeant Scholarships be awarded once every  
four years, one scholarship to commence  
in 1939 and the other in 1940" - was allowed  
and adopted, subject to the approval of the  
Committee of the Past Students Association.

The Visiting Committee's Report was given by  
Mr Maxwell. He and Mr George had visited the  
school on the evening of the 16<sup>th</sup> inst. One feature  
was the brick retaining wall that had been  
built by the caretaker, Mr H. Brew, during  
the last vacation. It was a decided improve-  
ment and would make it possible to have an  
attractive garden there. They had visited the  
Plumbing, Electric Wiring and Woodwork classes  
and had found keen students busily occupied.  
In the Engineering Department a new Shadow  
board caught their eyes. This was a very fine  
idea as also was the attractive show case.  
The work being turned out was in their opinion  
a credit to the school and the instructors.  
Finally they had inspected the Students' Room.  
This building badly needed painting and was  
an eye-sore from the streets. The Principal,  
Mr A. J. Herdline, said that the matter of painting  
the woodwork in the school buildings was in  
the hands of the Public Works Department and we
