Transfer of Fees paid from 2nd to 3rd term.

It was resolved that the fees paid by Stan Hall for the 2nd term be transferred to the 3rd term 1938. (Mrs Lederman & Maxwell)

Deputation to the Premier and the Minister of Public Instruction.

Dr. D. Maxwell reported that in company with the Principal he had attended the deputation that day. The Honorable the Minister of Public Instruction, Sir John Harris, received the representatives of the five diploma issuing schools and listened to the case which was presented by the President of the London Institute of Technology, Leelong, and supported by himself and others at some length.

The Minister said that he was not prepared to recommend the requests to Cabinet as the deputation had failed to convince him of the advantages claimed for such alterations to the Regulations. After some pressure he promised to put the suggested alterations before Cabinet but without

bias and he also assured the deputation that a School Council's recommendation in a specific case would receive his careful consideration and, if it warranted it, his support.

Technical Schools' Conference, Leelong, 27 October

It was resolved that the Association be notified that at this stage it was impossible to indicate what accommodation, if any, would be required and that the President, a Vice-President, and the Principal would represent this school.
