C. Barrow said that he and C. Jones had

visited the school on the evening of September 18th. Their first port of call was the Art School where classes were proceeding satisfactorily. They were very interested in the library which contained some excellent books and appeared up-to-date and well cared for. They noticed that water had entered on the south wall of the Life Classroom and recommended that this matter be given attention. In the Art Block and Pottery departments excellent work was being done although in the latter the Instructor, Mr. J. Sengrove, said the burning process was out of date and he would very much like to have an electric kiln installed. The approximate cost was £200. They also noted the marked improvements that had been effected in the grounds at the rear of the Science Block. The Carstake, Mr. H. Brew, had told them that he was keen to continue the brick retaining wall on the right hand side of the first flight of steps if he could have the necessary materials and some assistance. Mr. Jones said that they then visited the Machine Shop where they found that the painting of machines had made a big improvement. There were a fair number of students in attendance and they were all very keen on their work. He considered that the excellent showcase in this Department could be displayed to much advantage in some conspicuous place in Sturt Street.
