Staffing in Art School.

In reply to a question regarding this matter Mr. Smith said that Mr. D. Molineux had been transferred to Caulfield Technical School at a moment's notice and without anyone here having been consulted. Mr. Molineux was an experienced in Commercial Art and was a very valuable man. The Department had sent us Mr. Beaumont from Bendigo but as he does not possess the Secondary Teachers Drawing Certificate and has had no experience in Commercial Art his services could not be used in the Art School so he has joined the staff of the Junior Technical School.
