Girls Preparatory Classes.

The Principal reported that in the interim since the last meeting he had interviewed Mr. W. R. Dean Acting Chief Inspector regarding this matter. Mr. Dean said that a visit to Geelong would be worth while as the Gordon Institute had overcome the difficulty of getting sufficient enrolments for their girls school.

He also expressed the advisability of getting the Government to reserve the Old Court House for educational purposes and then to take steps to have it made over to the school. He further suggested that when that was done adult classes be started there and a course to fit girls for either the Art School or the Commercial School be instituted. In Mr. Dean's opinion the Chief Inspector of Secondary Schools would block any more to take girls from the 6th grade.

It was resolved that the Principal visit Geelong for the purpose of ascertaining what the action taken there to overcome the difficulty
