He with the cooperation of the Council, had put up a big fight to have an error on the part of the Education Department rectified and was successful.

The financial position was now quite satisfactory and the overdraft which could not be avoided last year would soon be wiped off.

In his opinion Technical Schools were now assuming much greater importance than formerly. After the war Technical Education would go ahead with leaps and bounds but buildings and equipment were wholly inadequate for the important job that lies ahead. This Council was very anxious to extend Technical Education in Ballarat but had been handicapped by lack of accommodation and equipment.
