He noticed that smoke and sparks were issuing from this broken chimney and considered that there was grave risk of fire.

He then visited the Junior School and was delighted with what he saw. In Mr Jeffery's he felt that the school was in very safe hands for many years to come. The garden and grounds were in fine order and

and good protection had been provided against air raids.
