The President extended a warm welcome to Mr. Simcock and Mr. Sweeney and explained the object of the meeting.

He said that there was a definite call for technicians in Ballarat and it was the wish of the School Council to cooperate with other local educational bodies with a view to ensuring that the right boy attended the right school.

He said that it was felt that there must be ways by which it is possible to direct boys into the right channels. It had been suggested that a coordinator of education in Ballarat would be a method of solving the problem.
