Visiting Committee's Report.

Mr. Middleton said that an inspection of the school had been made by Mr. Maxwell and himself on the 28 September. They visited the Survey Room, where there was a new colour scheme, and found that the room was very bright and in marked contrast to other class-rooms. In the Pottery Room they inspected the new furnace and some recent turns of glazed ware. They then visited the Chemistry Department and found it much cleaner and tidier than formerly. The painting, which had recently been carried out, had brightened the entrance considerably. The lecture room badly needed re-painting but it

would be too big a job for the School to tackle out of the maintenance grant. The floors in the passage leading from the Assay Department were in a very bad state and they understood that the Public Works Department was to attend to it. Other places visited were - the Wiring Class, Blacksmithing and Welding and the Machine Shop. In this department they found a blaze of light as the result of the recent improvements carried out by the Public Works Department.

Generally speaking the conditions of the various classes they visited were excellent.

Mr. Maxwell in supplementing the report said that on another occasion he had visited the school grounds and the Students' Room. The former were in a state of transition with beds being made ready for planting. The Students' Room was vastly improved, both in appearance and order.
