Proposed new buildings

The President said that as the result of the visit of the Minister (Hon. J. J. Holloway), the Director (Ch. J. A. Selby), Acting Chief Inspector (Ch. W. K. Dean) and the Chief Architect (Ch. P. Sacereth) on Friday, 28th April, an enlarged plan of the block comprising present school property, the gaol and old court house had been prepared and was now available for inspection and comment. Much work had been done during the period since the Ministerial visit and he desired to compliment Messrs A. E. Lambert and L. J. J. Hillman on the fine job they had done and to thank them on behalf of the Council. Continuing, the President said that the plan had been drawn to a scale of 1 inch to 20 feet and on it new buildings and old buildings which it was proposed to retain were shown
