Junior Technical School.
C^r M. Hutchison said that a recent survey made by him disclosed that 87 boys now in attendance at the High School and the two Post Primary schools would have enrolled at the Junior Technical School if accommodation had been available. Sixty of these pupils had presented at the Entrance Examination but were unsuccessful.
