Visiting Committee's Report.

C. S. Jones reported that an inspection was carried out by the President and himself on the 14th May. The students' room was in better condition than it had been on previous visits but was not tidy nor did it look as though it received a daily sweep out. In the Assay Department they found everything in good order with the exception of the passage floor which was still awaiting attention by the Public Works Department.

The art school was then inspected and the matter of staffing and time-tables was discussed with Mr. Johnston. It was quite evident that Mr. Johnston was attempting an impossibility in trying to take up to three classes at one time.

It was grossly unfair to both students and Instructor. Their next port of call was the Pottery Department where they saw some very fine samples of pottery which were the result of the last term.

It was felt that it would be well worth while displaying examples of pottery in local shop windows so that the public see the class of work this department could turn out. They then inspected the new buildings in course of erection. The progress so far was

slow but the contractor expected an improvement shortly when additional labour became available. They found that the grounds were reasonably tidy for this time of year. On leaving the school they noticed that the paintwork on the Museum building was in very bad condition although it was only about four years since it was repainted.
