Business

The President in opening the meeting said that the present school buildings were inadequate and the increasing demands for reconstruction training of discharged service personnel in other than trade courses could not be met unless an early start was made on the next section of the Master Plan prepared last year.

The Principal had been informed by Mr. E. Eltham, Director of Reconstruction Training, that the £300,000 made available to Victorian Technical schools was for the provision of trade classes and the Government's policy was not to spend any of that money in providing accommodation in centres where munition factories had been built. It was intended that these factories would ultimately be used to accommodate trade classes.
