The Registrar reported that the authority received from the Education Department for the temporary employment of Mr. S. H. Lengrove at a salary of £348 per annum, less the Government's proportion of his pension, meant that Mr. Lengrove would receive £240-4-7 plus £30 cost of living allowance and his pension of £156 per annum - a total of £426-4-7 compared with £561, which was his salary and cost of living allowance immediately preceding his retirement.
