The President then moved the adoption
of the Annual Report and Statement
of Receipts and Payments.

He drew attention to the attendances
of members of the Council at meetings
held during the year and congratulated
C. S. D. Charwell in again achieving
100% attendance at meetings.

He also referred to its being the

75th annual report on the activities of the
school, and said that it gave some
indication of the important part the school
had played and was playing in the
higher education of students.

The bank position was healthy and
the number of enrolments for the year
(1517) was an all time record. The
Council was grateful for scholarships
donated and for the helpful publicity
received through the Ballarat Courier.

Several items of valuable equipment
had been added during the year
and the new workshop units were
progressing. Accommodation was
an embarrassing problem as many
classes were full and the school
was unable to take additional
students.

C. S. Lederman seconded the adoption
of the report and financial statement
and congratulated the President on a
very successful year and an excellent
report. The school was doing a very
important job for young people in
Ballarat and district, but was
unable to do it completely owing to
lack of accommodation. He decided
to state that this state of affairs
was not news to the Education Department.

had been urging the Department to
