Visiting Committee's Report

Mrs Beauland and Lynch reported that  
they had visited the school on the  
11<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> July.

In the Carpentry class at the old  
Court House there were forty students  
and two instructors. Although  
somewhat cramped in this temporary  
accommodation the class appeared  
to be functioning very satisfactorily.

In the new building in Albert Street  
the Blacksmithing and Welding classes  
had only recently taken possession  
of their new quarters and were  
in process of settling down. The  
contractor was still working on the  
building thereby making the transfer  
somewhat difficult. They recommended  
that the blower in the Blacksmithing  
department be housed in a separate  
compartment to eliminate noise.

They also wished to point out that  
no provision had been made for a  
lecture room in the Carpentry and  
Blacksmithing sections.

They also inspected the Mechanical  
Engineering laboratories and lecture room.
