The Visiting Committee's Report was read by Mr. L. A. Farr.

The report stated that Geo Farr and Callow had made an inspection of the Art School, Students' Room, Assay and Chemistry Departments on the 23rd September.

In the Art School the painting of the walls and ceilings by crance painters was very favourably commented on. Attention was drawn to the worn and rough floors and the table tops in the Model Drawing room.

It was suggested that staining the floors and chasonite tops on the tables would effect an improvement.

Attention was also drawn to the steel framed windows in the South wall, and it was suggested that efforts be made to get the Public Works Department to undertake this job as soon as possible. The shade curtains were in a dilapidated condition and efforts should be made to have them renewed.

In the Students' Room there were two holes in the floor and the brick drain at the entrance should be regraded to form a storm water to drain away.

In the Assay Department they found a state of corrosion at the lapping joints of the iron roof. The floor in the porchway was also in need of attention. It was their opinion that

16-10-46 The roof should receive early attention otherwise it would be completely corroded in from six to twelve months.

The Chemistry Department needed painting throughout and more attention should be given to the cleaning of this department.

The report was received and adopted. (Mrs Nicholson & Mr. Nicholson)

The President drew attention to various matters in the Auditor's Report and stated that the explanations required would be forwarded to the Education Department.

The report was received on the motion of Mr. Nicholson seconded by Mr. Jones.
