

11-12-46 Motor Mechanics.

The President said that a class in motor mechanics could be considered to be essential. Money had been provided by the Education Department for the purchase of equipment through the Disposals Commission and the large motor and oil companies were keenly interested in the matter.

The first need was accommodation and this could be provided by erecting a brick building near the entrance to the Battery. An alternative was the securing of a hut or huts from the Red Cross Society which would possibly provide accommodation for Woodtassing also. Steps were now being taken to secure Red Cross huts which were available.
