Visiting Committee's Report.

Mrs Lynch and Savage reported that
they had made an inspection of
the Administrative and Science
Block, Gardens and Grounds
on the 14 April.

They found that the class rooms
and laboratories had all been
painted and renovated by
the Reconstruction Corps with
most pleasing results. In the
Commercial Department the unsightly
partition had been removed with
the result that all the students
are now under the eyes of the
Instructors at the same time.

In the grounds it was recommended
that the garden be extended to
cover the sloping ground from
the present beds to the rear of
the lavatories. It was also
recommended that the yard
adjacent to the new buildings be
cleaned up and surfaced and
that attention be given to a strip
between the asphalt footpath and
the new brick retaining wall as
the asphalt is showing signs of
crumbling.
