Mess Lutton and Small reported that they had made an inspection of the Art School, Assay and Chemistry Building and the Students' Room on the 12<sup>th</sup> day.

In the Students' Room they found that the linoleum on the floor was in very poor condition and they suggested that malthoid covering might be worth considering.

The corrosion of <sup>the</sup> iron roof on the Assay Laboratory was also noted. In the Pottery Room they inspected the new gas-fired kiln and noted that this room was very cramped. The natural lighting was also poor.

The boiler which supplies the Art School heating system with hot water had developed a crack in the rear end. This had been repaired temporarily pending attention by the Public Works Department.

They also noticed that the radiators were not very hot and would suggest that a circulating pump be installed near the boiler.

The re-painting of rooms in the Art School and Assay and Chemistry buildings was noted and they were informed that the remainder of the rooms were to be painted in the near future.
