Building Programme
 The President outlined the history of the long-range plan and the school's requirements. He said that the Council was of the opinion that the first objective should be the building of a new Chemistry Department, Electrical Engineering Department and Drawing Department incorporated in a three story building to be erected on the Grant Street side of the Old Court House. Mr. Everett had expressed his willingness to proceed with detailed plans if the Department approved of the first step being taken.
 Mr. Nilsson said that he felt that Mr. Everett's ideas had changed since he had made that statement. The procedure now adopted by him was not to proceed with any drawings unless there was a reasonable chance of building being commenced at an early date.
