The Principal said that owing to the increase in apprentices attending classes there was need for additional instruction which at present would provide half a time-table for an additional instructor. He expected that additional numbers next year would make the position more acute and to meet it when it arose he felt that a move should be made now to seek authority for an additional appointment. By transferring some of his own teaching load (which was much too heavy) he could justify such an appointment now.

It was resolved that the matter be left in the hands of the President and the Principal with power in the hands of the Finance Committee to take appropriate action.

• Appointment of Instructor in Charge of Mechanical Engineering

The President said that only one additional application had been received for this position as the result of re-advertising it throughout Australia. As the new applicant did not hold a University Degree the position was substantially the same as it was when the original applications were considered.

After a discussion on the question as to whether the Education Department would be prepared to appoint Mr. E. J. Barker on loan when he joins the Departmental instructional staff at the end of this year in preference to approving his appointment to this position it was resolved that Mr. Barker's appointment be recommended and that the matter of negotiation regarding alternative solutions of the difficulty be left in the hands of the President and the Principal with power.
