General Classification of Registrar

The President said that with the exception of junior instructors and the cleaners the Registrar was the lowest paid member of the male staff. The matter had been discussed with the Minister during his recent visit and information received since indicated that the Minister expected the matter to be brought before him by a letter from the School Council. The Principal said that in his opinion the Registrar's position was bound up with the status of the

school and the Principal. Mr Kittson said that if a letter were sent he would follow it up by an interview with the Minister. It was agreed that a letter over the signature of the President be forwarded drafted by the President, Mr Farr, the Principal and the Registrar, and forwarded to the Education Department.
