Minutes The minutes of the last meeting of the Council
held on the 15 June, were taken as
read and were confirmed.

Business Leaves of Absence - Mr. A. G. Blake, Chairman

discussing the matter with Mr. Blake
he and the Principal decided to grant

Visiting Committee's Report

Mrs. Stoker and Lyall reported that they
had inspected the Old Court House,
Woolclassing and Motor Mechanics Clubs
on the 14 July. In the Old Court House
they found Electrical Engineering, Electric
Wiring, Refrigeration, Radio and Civil
Engineering classes. Good use was
being made of the old building and
shutters were recently installed in
their work.

In the Motor Mechanics Club the set-up
was quite satisfactory, although somewhat
restricted owing to lack of space.

In the Woolclassing Club they also found
a very satisfactory set-up with
