he told the Chairman and the Director that the effect on our school would be very marked and the School Council would be very disappointed to learn that it was intended to proceed with the change. It would be the Council's duty to inform the Premier, as local representative, of the position. Mr Farr, continuing ^{his report} said ~~that~~ he felt that the schools could only fight the case on the centralisation issue and to do that it was necessary to take the matter past the Minister to Cabinet. The President then invited comment from each member present and read a draft of a letter which it was proposed to forward to the Minister in reply to his and the Director's arguments.

Members were unanimous in favouring an approach to Cabinet through the Premier and it was resolved that the matter be left in the hands of the Committee appointed on the 21st September to discuss with Mr. Kibbisa ways and methods of implementing the expressed wishes of the Council.
