Visiting Committee's Report

Mrs. Lyall reported that he had made
an inspection of the Art School on 14th
April.

The art staff told him that they were
finding the Annual Art Course more
difficult as the result of recent
changes in the syllabus. He noticed
that the floors had been renovated
but curtains and blinds in some of
the rooms needed attention. Storage
facilities were very limited
and ventilation in the junior art
room was poor. Miss Morgan had
informed him that more four shaft
looms were needed for weaving
instruction and Mr. Punning had
mentioned the need for an experimental
Room in the Pottery Department. Staff
accommodation and amenities
were inadequate.

Mrs. Small reported that he had
inspected the Art and Chemistry
Departments and the Students' Room.
In the Chemistry Department the walls
were badly stained again as the result
of fumes and faulty ventilation although
the two painted patches on the walls
for experimental purposes appeared to be
