

10-5-50 In their opinion the staff room, locker and lavatory accommodation were totally inadequate for the numbers concerned. They had been informed that two cricket pitches were needed and that the Activities Account would provide for a substantial part of the cost. It was suggested that application be made to the Education Department for a subsidy in connection with this matter. They found that the lighting in room 5 was unsatisfactory even though the Chemistry wall across the right-of-way had been repaired recently. Some broken brickwork near the coke chute required attention.

The report was received and adopted. (Mrs Kittson & Small)

Junior Technical School Repairs etc  
The Principal said that a large ~~portion~~ <sup>section</sup> of spouting was repaired about two years ago but the present faulty section had apparently been overlooked by the Public Works Department. He had ordered 180 lockers about a month ago but it would be difficult to find a place for them. The broken tiles were being repaired and he would look into the matter of broken brickwork near the coke chute.

10-5-50 As regards lavatory accommodation the position in the senior school, particularly in the female section, was also being unsatisfactory. He would suggest that the Education Department be requested to provide six additional lavatories <sup>two</sup> in the junior school yard, two for the trade section of the senior school and two in the Dressmaking Yard for females. This suggestion was adopted and the Principal agreed to contact the local Inspector of Works as well. (Mrs Kittson & Small)  
The Principal said that he would also look into the matter of lighting in room 5 and would keep in mind the provision of two cricket pitches for next summer. The subsidy for this year had already been <sup>received</sup> ~~awarded~~ of the Junior School for the Gymnasium and the library.
