It was resolved that the two
applicants be interviewed by Vice-
President Mr. J. A. Farr, the Principal
and the Registrar and that they
have power to make a recommendation
to the Education Department.

The Chairman said that two applica-
tions had been received for this position.
Both applicants were diplomates of
the school and one (Mr. W. Whitehead)

also held a degree in Civil Engineering
of the University of Melbourne.

The Principal said that both
applicants were very young but
because of the importance of Civil
Engineering at present and the
large number of students doing this
course he felt that preference
should be given to Mr. Whitehead. The
matter of University recognition also
had to be considered and he did
not expect any difficulty in this
connection if Mr. Whitehead were
appointed. As Mr. Whitehead was
a Civil Engineering arrangements
would have to be made for certain
mining subjects to be taken by other
instructors but no difficulties were
expected.

After discussing the youth of the
applicant in relation to the
classification of the position and the
fact that he does not possess the
qualifications for the dual position
it was resolved that Mr. Whitehead
be offered recommendation for
appointment at classification C1,
£700 instead of B1 £800 as advertised.
