

21-6-50 The Department would agree to Mr. Whitehead's appointment at classification C.3 £250 per week plus P.B. £500 as a provision. Mr. Whitehead had agreed to accept appointment at this classification but would not be able to commence duty before the end of summer.

It was resolved that this appointment be recommended to the Council.

Plumbers and Technical Work

The chairman reported that Messrs. G. H. G. and F. G. Wilson had been interviewed on the 13th and 14th June.

All were highly qualified Plumbers but Mr. G. H. G. impressed most as to his extensive experience in technical work with the C.I.R.C. One of the advantages claimed for Mr. Wilson was his education but called to my attention the necessity of examining. It was resolved that the appointment of Mr. G. H. G. to his position be recommended to the Council.

The Department intended advertising the position of Head Master of the Junior School in July and in all probability it would be advertised as a class 1 position.

It was decided that this report be submitted to the Council.
