All were highly qualified Plumbers but Mr. Skull impressed most as he had had extensive experience in Sheetmetal Work with the C.S.I.R.O.

One of the applicants claimed Returned Soldier qualification but failed to impress with personality or training.

It was resolved that the appointment of Mr. R. E. Skull to this position be recommended to the Council.

The Principal reported that he had interviewed the Chief Inspector and had requested authority to re-advertise this position at classification C. I. £700. The Chief Inspector was not prepared to give a decision but suggested that Mr. Cornell be employed on a session basis for teaching periods and on a per centage of fees for analyses after

Junior Technical School Staff.

The Principal reported that the retired Head Teacher located by Mr. Lyall was not acceptable to the Technical School Inspectors. A retired female teacher had subsequently been located but had accepted a position before she could be contacted.

The Department intended advertising the position of Head Master of the Junior School in July and in all probability it would be advertised as a class 1 position.

It was decided that this report be submitted to the Council.
