Visiting Committee's Report.

The Chairman reported that he had
made an inspection of the Electrical
and Motor Mechanics Departments on
Tuesday, 20th June. Mr. Kutton was
unable to attend owing to Parliamentary
duties in Melbourne.

In the Motor Mechanics section he found
a class of Farm Mechanics enthusiastically
dismantling an old car chassis.
He found that the Instructor, Mr. F.
Hamilton, had arranged several
engines on stands to enable
students to work on them. These
engines, mainly secondhand, included
overhead and side valve car engines
and a diesel truck engine. The
Instructor also had a valuable and
comprehensive set of strip films and
a number of wall charts and
cut away sections of car parts
for instructional purposes. The
storeroom annex to the Court
House had been completed and
was serving a very useful purpose.
In the Electrical Engineering Department
no class was in operation but
Mr. F. Hillman took him round and
showed him the set-up. Mr. Hillman
was very enthusiastic and had managed
to secure a lot of used equipment,
mainly in the Refrigeration section, for
instructional purposes.
